Do you know of a local community green space project that would benefit from up to £12,000? If so, there are Bags of Help at hand!

The money raised from the 5p bag charge in Tesco stores is being used to pay for a large number of local projects to improve green spaces in communities across the UK. Grants of £8,000, £10,000 and £12,000 are on offer through the scheme.

**THE MARSH MAIL News from Linton Village College**

The relative status of subjects taught in schools has become an increasingly politicised issue, not least because of recent government changes to accountability measures that inherently place different levels of importance on them.

The new Progress 8 measure gives a double weighting to maths and English and expects students to take three EBacc subjects (including languages, sciences, geography and history). The emphasis on this kind of traditional curriculum has led to rhetoric about the sidelining of the Arts in schools. Some institutions are making significant changes to timetabling and option choices to reflect this new emphasis.

While I welcome a commitment to an inclusive and challenging curriculum and the focus on science and technology, this should not be at the expense of a broad and balanced education. Neither should there be an assumption that it is only STEM education (science, technology, engineering and maths) that will open doors for future employment opportunities, or that the Arts provide a softer, less rigorous option or a light relief or distraction from academic achievement.

At Linton we strive for all students to have access to a holistic education that enables them to be innovative, creative and passionate across disciplines. An enriching and varied education should complement the three Rs, not undermine them.

I am saddened when I hear of schools that have removed arts experiences from their curriculum or sidelined enrichment to focus on their core subjects. Anyone who visited our school show last month will have appreciated the sheer talent and culmination of skill that makes the involvement in such a performance an incredible achievement. Many will also appreciate how the determination, grit, resilience and relationships developed through this kind of experience will complement and support other studies. We need to celebrate and protect the importance that sport and the Arts have in comprehensive education and recognise how such subjects enable and enrich students' personal development and success, regardless of the current political agenda.

Dear all

As I sit, with the glorious sunshine pouring through the window, I am reflecting that as I write this message we are just entering the two weeks prior to Easter known as Passiontide, yet when you read this Easter Sunday will have been celebrated! We will then be in the period known in the Church's calendar as the Octave of Easter and Paschal Tide.

The celebration of the feast of Easter (falling this year on Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> March), like that of all great feasts of the Church, continues for eight days or an octave. During the week following Easter Sunday various post-resurrection appearances of Christ are celebrated in daily worship. The Octave ends on the first Sunday after Easter which is known as Low Sunday (3<sup>rd</sup> April). This name is apparently intended to convey the contrast between this day and the great Easter festival which preceded it, as well as to indicate that as the Octave Day it is part of the Easter feast but in a lower degree.

The time from the end of the Octave of Easter to the eighth day after Pentecost (23<sup>rd</sup> May 2016) is called Paschal Tide. The two great feasts celebrated during this time are Ascension (Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> May) and Pentecost (Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> May).

So why does the date of Easter and the subsequent feasts move?

Easter is called a moveable feast because the date of Easter changes every year. Easter Sunday can fall on any date from 22 March to 25 April. The reason for this variation in the date of Easter is based on the lunar calendar rather than our more well-known solar one. Easter always falls on the first Sunday following the full Moon (the Paschal Full Moon) after 21 March. If the Full Moon falls on a Sunday, then Easter is the next Sunday.

Pagan traditions give us the English word "Easter" which comes from the word "Eostre". However, it should be remembered that Christians celebrated the resurrection of Christ long before the word "Easter" was used, and the word they used for the celebration was "Pascha", which is derived from and linked to the Jewish festival of Passover. According to Bede, the English monastic historian, the English word Easter comes from the Anglo-Saxon name for the month of April, which was known as "Eostremonath" (the month of openings) and, since Pascha was most often celebrated in Eostremonath, the English Christians began calling it "Easter". Bede also notes that the month was named after the Anglo-Saxon goddess Eostre. Rituals related to the goddess Eostre focus on new beginnings, fertility and new life, symbolized now by the Easter egg.

So perhaps, for us all, Easter is about new beginnings, a reminder that the light of a new day is an opportunity to resurrect our lives with passion, purpose and joy.
