CARLTON CHURCHYARD

A great deal of work has been done to both tidy up and also make safe the churchyard by a number of people over recent weeks. Unsafe and dying trees have been felled and are being replaced with new ones whilst others have had the weight taken off branches making them less prone to splitting. This has all been achieved with the assistance of the BC Group Trust.

In addition, many thanks must go to Peter and Andrew Coppin who have voluntarily carried out an enormous amount of work in tidying up some very unkempt areas of the churchyard. With the assistance of Ian Wylie and John Mingay, unwanted tree stumps have been removed, and dilapidated tombstones within these areas have been completely rebuilt.

This has transformed the look in the churchyard, and has enabled people to view the fascinating details of people who once lived in the village. One such example is a gentleman named John Leslie Crosby who died aged 57 years in 1874. He's described on his tombstone as "Surgeon of Carlton". Did we have an unknown hospital in the village many years ago, or was this man as we suspect very adept at pulling out teeth and the like!

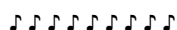

**BRINKLEY PLAYGROUND MAINTENANCE**

Brinkley Parish Council (BPC) has commissioned Fenland Leisure Products to give the children's play area on Beechcroft an overhaul. They will adjust, repair or replace some of the apparatus. For example, they will replace the rope ladder which is fraying and tighten the aerial ropeway which has developed a sag. There are about a half dozen items of equipment that need some form of attention. All may impact on safety in the longer term if early action is not taken.

To pay for the work, BPC were successful in applying for, and getting, a grant of £600 from Wadlow Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund, a local charity. This grant pays for most of the maintenance work; the rest will be paid for by BPC.

Fenland Leisure have not been able to give a date for being on site, it is weather dependent, but we are hoping for May if not then June. The work will be done mid-week and not at the weekend; it will take a couple of days depending on the size of the team.

So if you see some people doing things to the play area, you will know what they are up to. Moreover, if people are working, please keep your children away until Fenland Leisure has completed their work for safety's sake. It's alright to use the facility when people are not working on it.
