THE BIG GREEN BUS COMPANY



The Big Green Bus Company operates several buses that serve our villages. They are not very well used and this may be because residents are unaware of the times, routes and frequency of the various services.

A quick summary, at 16th July 2017, of routes through our villages. They obviously stop in other villages en-route.

Service 19 : Mon - Fri : Haverhill /Linton/ Brinkley/Burrough Green : 4 times a day.

Service 46 : Tuesday : Brinkley/Burrough Green/ Newmarket : 1 Return trip am. (Approx 2hrs in town.)

Service 903 : Mon, Tue, Thu, Fri, Sat, : Westley Waterless/ Newmarket : 1 return trip (Approx 2 ½ hrs in town)

Service 904 : Mon, Tue, Thu, Fri. : Brinkley/Carlton/Burrough Green/Newmarket : 1 return trip a day. (Approx 2 ½ hrs in town)

Service 47 : Mon- Fri : Brinkley/Burrough Green/ Westley Waterless/ Newmarket : 1 return trip . 8 hour stay.

BRINKLEY PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Speed Calming Measures

As you may be aware the Parish Council were successful in obtaining a grant from the Wadlow Wind Farm via the Cambridgeshire Community Fund for 2 mobile flashing speed signs for the village. There are four approved locations in the village and they will be moved between each of the locations on a regular basis. We expect them to be up and running by early August.

Weston Colville Road will also see speed calming measures implemented following a successful bid to the Local Highways Initiative. We will be in discussion with the County Highways team to agree the best measures for this location very soon. We expect there to be a local consultation as there was for the first phase in the High Street. In the autumn, the Parish Council will apply to the Local Highways Initiative scheme again and this time we are looking to secure funding for speed calming measures to the Carlton end of the High Street. This is part three of our phased approach to the problems.

Defibrillator

The Parish Council has applied for a grant from British Heart Foundation to provide the village with a defibrillator. We should hear in the next few months whether we have been successful in securing funding. We have not heard back from East Cambridgeshire District Council yet regarding the potential allocation of land for housing.

Allotments

There are currently 2 vacant allotment plots. Please let me know if you are interested in taking one on.

**AUGUST BULLETIN FROM CAMBRIDGESHIRE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE**

With the Summer Holidays in full swing and a heatwave upon us, we are warning young people to stay safe in the County's waterways and making you aware of the dangers of swimming in open water.

With the sun shining, the public and particularly young people are more inclined to gather around waterways to socialise and enjoy the weather, and we have seen this during the past weeks.

We want to remind people to keep our **#RememberRony** campaign on their minds before they get tempted to cool down in rivers and lakes and instead go to a supervised lido. Young people often gather near lakes and rivers, some of which are not always the easiest to access for emergency vehicles and many which are actually private property, not designed for public swimming with no lifeguard on site. The fire service's **#RememberRony** campaign aims to educate young people about the risks associated with open water. It is backed by the family of Huntingdon schoolboy Rony John, who sadly died in 2014 during the first week of the summer holidays, while playing with friends in the Great River Ouse.

It is important for parents and young people to be aware of the many risks that open water possesses, such as being deeper than anticipated, with hazards below the surface to get trapped on. Even though the sun may be shining, the water could still be very cold causing the body to cramp up quickly and posing a risk to your getting out the water safely.

It is also important that if you see someone in trouble in water that you know what to do. Call 999 immediately with clear details of your location and if possible send someone to the nearest road to flag down the emergency services when they arrive. You can find the nearest life ring or anything that could help them float, and if someone goes under the water, mark on the water's edge the place they were last seen with something like a piece of clothing.

MARSH MAIL News from Linton Village College

A young person's education consists of all sorts of experiences beyond the regular curriculum at LVC. As well as learning important knowledge and skills that will help them to achieve success in academic study and the next steps in their lives, opportunities at school also help our young people to learn valuable life lessons about themselves and their communities.

Our PSHE (personal, social and health education) and enrichment programmes are ways in which students do this. Through a diverse range of topics and activities, our young people are enabled to mature and develop their understanding of their own personal development and of the world around them.

As with every generation that has come before them, it is a challenging and exciting time to be a young adult. With a degree of uncertainty about what the future has to hold, and the promise of the change that they have the power to enact, we aspire to help our students to play a positive and productive role in their communities and in wider society. A key element of this is to develop their confidence, independence and sense of responsibility.

One way in which we help young adults to broaden their horizons and learn from those that are different as well as similar to themselves is by providing opportunities to travel and benefit from an exposure to new experiences and contexts.

This academic year there has been a great range of local and international excursions. In the last month, students of all ages have participated in the Wind Band Tour to Croatia, playing live music in a number of town squares across the Adriatic coastline. Currently twenty of our Year 11 students are on a Camps International adventure in Cambodia. Following a great deal of personal fundraising, they are spending four weeks exploring the country and helping to contribute to community infrastructure through charity volunteer work, such as helping to build schools.

These kinds of life experiences are character-shaping and help our young people to grow, learn and mature in all kinds of ways that can't be tested or measured through a formal exam.
