CARLTON - BIN COLLECTION DAY CHANGES

What?

From the end of February most households across South Cambridgeshire will have a change to the day that their bins are emptied; the sequence of their collection (order that black or blue and green are put out); or their collection time (the time of day the bins are usually emptied). Everyone will still have their black bin emptied one week and their blue and green bins emptied the following week.

When?

The new bin days will start from Monday 27 February 2017. All residents affected, will receive a leaflet from the Council ahead of the changes with a collection schedule for their village. For collections in the meantime (up to 24 February), residents are urged to check the winter issue of South Cambs Magazine or the website - www.scambs.gov.uk/bin-changes

How?

Residents are asked to continue to put their bins out on their usual day up to 24 February, and after this date use the new schedule attached (this will also be included in the spring South Cambs Magazine - out between 28 Feb and 19 Mar). Please ensure bins are out for collection by 6am to avoid missing the collection.

Why?

In order to save £700,000 over three years, we now have a shared waste collection service for South Cambridgeshire and Cambridge City. New bin collection rounds will work across the City and South Cambs boundary, travelling approximately 20,000 fewer miles per year saving money and reducing traffic and emissions. The savings will help meet some of the Council's overall targets as the funding we receive from Government has been cut considerably. The new rounds mean that we need to make changes to collection days for most properties.

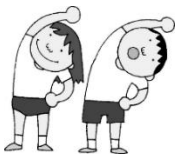

**MARSH MAIL - News from Linton Village College**

Extra-curricular opportunities are a key strand of schooling. There is a reason why this element of our provision is entitled 'Enrichment' at LVC; such experiences are truly enriching for students' learning and their wider, formative education.

I'm sure that most adults can fondly recall trips from their own school days. My highlights include a French exchange, aged 11, and the increased independence and cultural exposure that the trip to Lille involved.

International, far-flung adventures and local excursions certainly have the ability to enhance, extend and enrich children's learning.

At LVC, students have a plentiful enrichment offer. This term, students have benefited from enterprise, careers and science trips including a visit to Dalehead Foods and Oxford University. This month we wish our GCSE French students 'Bon voyage' as they embark on a week's immersive stay at a Château. Meanwhile, plans for our annual Enrichment Week are underway with almost every Year 9 student signed up for a residential trip to Derbyshire, Paris or Lanzarote, and significant fundraising is taking place for our Camps International trip to Cambodia in the summer.

Enrichment opportunities such as these offer students the chance to develop relationships and a raft of personal skills as well as memories (confidence, endurance, risk-taking and responsibility to name but a few). They also have the potential to be transformative opportunities: to spark a passion or interest that might have remained untapped in the parameters of a regular classroom.

Staff invest time and energy above and beyond their regular duties to organise and supervise school trips, often giving up their evenings, weekends and holidays, because they recognise their value and importance.

As a comprehensive state school, we want all of our students to benefit from enriching learning opportunities. While our trips vary in terms of budget, money can ultimately be a barrier for a number of families.

LVC's Trust Fund enables voluntary contributions from parents, the school's alumni and members of the community to provide financial subsidy for families that would otherwise struggle to afford extra-curricular activities. - ✓ Have during the whole of the 12 months preceding that day occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the council area; or
- ✓ have during that same period had your principal or only place of work in the council area; or
- ✓ You can also satisfy the criteria to be elected if you have lived in the council area or within 3 miles of it for the whole of the 12 months preceding the "relevant day".

**You cannot stand as a Parish Councillor if you:**

- ✗ are subject of a bankruptcy restriction order or interim order
- ✗ have, within five years before the day of the election/co-option, been convicted in the United Kingdom of any offence and have had a sentence of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) for a period of over three months without the option of a fine
- ✗ Work for the council you want to become a councillor for (but you can work for other local authorities, including the principal authorities that represent the same area).

**Tinnitus**

It is estimated 5 million Britons will suffer with Tinnitus at some point in their lives. Tinnitus is one of the commonest physical symptoms affecting humanity and yet people who develop tinnitus often feel very alone. In fact, mild tinnitus is extremely widespread and even severe tinnitus is more common than you might think.

People who are asked to describe tinnitus use words like hissing, sizzling, buzzing, humming and clicking to describe what they here.

For those that find tinnitus distressing it can be life-altering. Individuals and their families can struggle to sleep, concentrate and feel deeply irritable and agitated.

Because Tinnitus has many causes and impacts there is no single solution and no cure but a 'path' to management of its symptoms can be very effective.

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**FEBRUARY BULLETIN FROM CAMBRIDGESHIRE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE**

On-call firefighters are a vital part of today's fire and rescue service, providing an efficient, effective service that gives emergency cover to more than 90 per cent of the UK.

In Cambridgeshire they make up 56 per cent of the workforce.

An on-call firefighter is not based at a fire station but carries a pager and responds to emergency incidents as and when they happen.

They receive an annual wage to reflect the time they commit to being available plus additional payments for attending incidents and drill nights (one evening a week for two hours).

On-call firefighters are men and women who may have other jobs and are able to provide evening, daytime or weekend cover. When they are on-call they may be at home, working for themselves or for a nearby company or out in their local community (staying within a five-minute travel time of the fire station) and are generally located in rural communities, small towns and villages.

As I write this, Christmas decorations are up, people are wearing Christmas jumpers all around me and the river is frozen over (indeed people are skating on it - quite safely - and some people are even driving on it). No - I'm not really early for the deadline for the February newsletter! I'm in St. Petersburg, Russia, on business. Orthodox churches celebrate Christmas rather later than we do - down to the change to the Gregorian calendar many years ago - it's 13 days later currently (and will change to 14 days later in 2100, but I suspect I won't be around to notice).

Epiphany is considered in part a festival of light, and the many beautiful churches in this city show that to me, by being picked out by the amazingly clear sun in the sky; which for some reason only seems to shine on them (it's because the sun is really quite low in the sky and the church buildings have enough space around them for there to be no shadows of other buildings). St. Petersburg is an ancient city, but feels young and "happening".

Of course, many of us will remember that in the days of the Soviet Union, the city was called Leningrad. Religious faith was not well tolerated in Soviet days; and the name referring to St. Peter was definitely not "politically correct". Leningrad as a name hasn't disappeared completely; you still catch the fast train to here from the Leningradskya Railway station in Moscow, or, as I did this trip, fly into an airport whose code is still LED.

With the change in political system, religious freedoms came to Russians; churches were restored. The Russian people enjoyed that light - their own Epiphany if you will. Many of my trips remind me how important to us our own religious freedoms are. I'm proud to call myself a Christian and to be able to put my name to this letter to you this month. There are still many places in the world where I could not do that for fear of discrimination or disadvantage. We have the freedom to have faith, or no faith; the freedom to express that faith publicly.
