This year was particularly hot and exhausting, and we hope that you have all recovered.

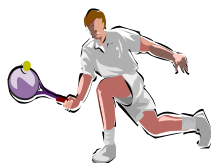
The net profit for this year is £2655 - an excellent total.

MARSH MAIL News from Linton Village College

Linton Village College has a strong reputation for industry links, having been designated a Business and Enterprise specialist school since September 2003. We continue to enjoy effective relationships with industry and our young people benefit from access to enterprise opportunities.

In June, all of our Year 10 students spent enrichment week engaged in work experience. Many had sourced their own placements to pursue a specific interest ranging from the Park Inn Radisson Hotel in Ostrava, Czech Republic and at the Aircraft Restoration Company Duxford, working on the BBMF Lancaster bomber, to experiencing legal practices in Haverhill and interior design in Linton. While we support our learners in developing skills ready for life beyond LVC, and provide them with careers education, advice and guidance, experiencing employment situations first-hand provides students with rich learning. For some it has confirmed career decisions, for others tested them. The feedback from our students and the companies about the week has been incredibly positive. As a member of Cambridgeshire and Peterborough's Local Enterprise Partnership we benefit from industry support, including careers training and business mentoring. Our long-standing partnership with Dalehead Foods, through the BITC Business Class programme, is an excellent example of the positive impact that business links can have. Our students have enjoyed annual enterprise projects and employability skills opportunities. The school has also benefited from improvements to the site through the company's volunteer scheme.

We have, in addition, been fortunate to receive financial donations from local businesses to support school events and projects. As has been well-publicised in the local and national press, education budgets are incredibly challenging at present due to real-term reductions in funding. The school is grateful for such generous monetary contributions.

We are keen to continue to develop wider community and business links to enrich the curriculum and provide students with opportunities for authentic, real-world learning. If any local companies are able to offer support we would be keen to hear from you. We would also welcome additional work experience placements for future cohorts.

**Commemorative Mosaic**

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**JULY BULLETIN FROM CAMBRIDGESHIRE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE**

As the weather brightens up and the sunshine starts brightening our weeks we welcome the longer, brighter nights and the opportunity to enjoy summer days and nights in the garden.

When powering up your BBQ's and putting out the garden furniture for the summer season, be sure to take note of our top tips below to ensure you have a fun and safe summer in the garden.

- If cooking outdoors, always check barbecues over after winter storage, keep them on level ground and ensure they are sited away from sheds, fences, overhanging foliage and property.
- Keep children and garden games well away from the cooking area and never leave the barbecue unattended.
- If you have a bonfire, build it well away from buildings, tents or other flammable objects and make sure it is properly out when you leave.
- When out in the countryside, extinguish cigarettes properly and dispose of them responsibly - never throw a lit cigarette into a field or wooded area.
- Don't forget to stay safe around our county's waterways and if you see someone in trouble in water, call 999 immediately with clear details of your location.
- When out camping or using a tent, never use candles inside or nearby and always discourage smoking nearby. Never cook inside a tent.

RADDESLEY BENEFICE

I'm always aware when writing for our news sheets that what I write at a particular time might be read maybe a month and a half later. Knowing that we had an election coming up I thought maybe I should wait until afterwards in case there was any change... I now find myself wishing I had written earlier and then I could always have used the excuse of the deadline.

So much has happened in recent weeks; as I write we are hoping and praying for residents of Grenfell Tower in London knowing many have lost their lives. I do, though, want to work a little on a theme; the extraordinary things that people do. We have seen the bravery of our emergency services and of ordinary men and women very clearly. The best of human nature comes through.

In the Church of England, in common with many other Christian churches, we have been celebrating the coming of the Holy Spirit after Jesus's death, resurrection and ascension. The gift of the Holy Spirit, as told in the Bible, enabled the Apostles, and other followers of Jesus (mostly ordinary people with no great education) to do incredible things, to speak in languages that they did not know previously and to spread the word about Jesus. The Holy Spirit gave them that personal power, the inner strength (not necessarily physical strength) to achieve incredible things.

I'm sure some of you might disagree with me (but isn't it good living in a society that tolerates such disagreement), but I have a certain admiration for those that put themselves forward for political office. Now, I might be just a bit biased here, as I am a Parish Councillor and I did stand some years ago for election to the District Council (and was dangerously close to being elected). With very few exceptions, the people that put themselves forward in such a way do this with a view to making things better. We might not agree with their views of what better is (and I'm always happy having a friendly discussion with them about why I don't agree with them either) or the methods they employ, but I very much admire a personal conviction, and the willingness to accept such responsibilities. There are undoubtedly divisions in this country and in the world. Some people look to exploit this violently and impose their will on others. Many more though, continue on their way, doing ordinary and extraordinary things. Some work in our emergency services, some take on elected office, many more are our "Army of Ordinary People" - to quote a modern hymn. As we enter a period of a new parliament and (at the time of writing, at least) some uncertainty as to the future, I pray that the Holy

Spirit works with those in authority to do what is right, to bring our nation, and our world, to peace.

Whatever your source of inner strength (and I am happy to say mine comes from the Holy Spirit) and those for our representatives, our emergency services, and those all over the world, may it refresh us, renew us and guide us.
