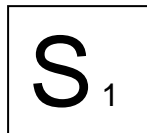

DO SOMETHING SPECIAL THIS NEW YEAR



Creating a safer
Cambridgeshire

Cambridgeshire police is urging residents who want to give something back to their community to consider becoming a Special.

With Christmas and then New Year approaching, what better time for people to consider doing something new, exciting and rewarding.

Not only does joining the Special Constabulary allow you to do something really positive and worthwhile, it also gives you unique and valuable skills and experience.

Specials are volunteer police officers who wear the same uniform, carry the same equipment and have the same powers as police officers, including the power of arrest.

They volunteer a minimum of just four hours a week and the constabulary can fit around their lifestyle.

Being a career Special is a vocation in its own right and there is a whole range of roles, including specialist areas such as road policing, the major crime unit and the rural crime action team (RCAT).

You could be tackling anti-social behaviour, involved in crowd control at major events, going on foot or vehicle patrol, assisting at the scene of collisions, fights or fires or enforcing road safety initiatives.

You will get professional training, skills and experience that can be used in everyday life and career progression. Training takes 10 weeks and consists of distance learning via online training packages that can be completed in your own time.

People often ask if being a Special could upset their employer. Our experience is that employers are usually extremely happy for staff to become Specials and many actually support them by giving paid time off while they're on duty.

Some organisations actively encourage their staff to become Specials and work in partnership with the Special Constabulary.

- ✓ Are available for PC meetings, held approximately six times a year after 7pm in the evenings. Usually the 4th Monday.
- ✓ Attend the odd training sessions
- ✓ Attend occasional consultation events and informative local authority meetings.
- ✓ Undertake any actions delegated to them from meetings.
- ✓ Receive and respond to PC emails in between meetings.
- ✓ May help with the Village activities or Village Litter pick etc.

TO BE A COUNCILLOR YOU NEED TO:

- ✓ Care about getting the best for your community.
- ✓ Have a willingness to represent your electorate.
- ✓ Want to make a difference.
- ✓ Undertake training courses.
- ✓ Adhere to the Code of Conduct.
- ✓ Register your interests.
- ✓ Have the time.
- ✓ Be committed and enthusiastic.

CAN YOU BE CO-OPTED OR ELECTED AS A COUNCILLOR?

You must be:

- ✓ a British Citizen of the Commonwealth or the European Union;
- ✓ Be 18 years of age or over
- ✓ during that 12-month period resided in the council area; or
- ✓ Have during the whole of the 12 months preceding that day occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the council area; or
- ✓ have during that same period had your principal or only place of work in the council area; or
- ✓ You can also satisfy the criteria to be elected if you have lived in the council area or within 3 miles of it for the whole of the 12 months preceding the "relevant day".

You cannot stand as a Parish Councillor if you:

- ✗ are subject of a bankruptcy restriction order or interim order
- ✗ have, within five years before the day of the election/co-option, been convicted in the United Kingdom of any offence and have had a sentence of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) for a period of over three months without the option of a fine
- ✗ Work for the council you want to become a councillor for (but you can work for other local

authorities, including the principal authorities that represent the same area).

**News from Linton Village College**

The advent of a new calendar year brings opportunities for reflection and ambition, two of the core Linton Learner values. For me, the date holds particular significance as it marks a year since I started as Principal of Linton Village College and Executive Principal of the Chilford Hundred Education Trust.

A recent piece of research into leadership styles published in the Harvard Business Review identified five types of head teachers: philosophers, surgeons, accountants, soldiers and architects. Each have their own characteristics; some enact immediate, short-term change, others take a long-term strategic view. I recognise myself as a philosophising architect. I recall a question posed to me by the student panel at interview: 'What has been your proudest achievement to date?' I expect that they were expecting me to share a specific, impressive accomplishment; my answer was 'lots of little things'.

In my inaugural Marsh Mail, I challenged the notion that effective leadership had to involve bold, resolute change and asserted my intention to maintain what is great about LVC, do more of what works well and reduce less successful elements.

Reflecting on 2016 at LVC and across the Trust, there has been a great deal of refining and re-defining - my first year has definitely been more of an evolution than a revolution.

Our Year 11 students are currently in the process of submitting applications for post-16 study. A key element has been writing personal statements including their motivations, achievements, skills and ambitions for the future. Despite belonging to a selfie generation, many of our young people have found this kind of self-promotion uncomfortable.

2016 was an interesting year in terms of leadership role models for them. While at school we promote the virtues of hard graft and grit, our students have witnessed the power of personality and popularity on the world's stage. Although charisma and entertainment value may encourage a following, let's hope that our young people recognise that substance is more important than style.

John Dunford's 4 Hs make for a very helpful blueprint for leadership and wider success in life: hope, humanity, humility and humour.
