For those of you who are unaware of the NGS, it is a national charity which is celebrating its 90th anniversary this year. Sadly, all of us know of people close to us who have been unfortunate enough to need these very worthwhile causes. (Incidentally, 90 pence in every £1 raised goes to these charities which is a marvellous record for a National organisation).

There will be an excellent plant stall from Hedgehog Nurseries. Homemade teas will be available in The Reading Room and the money raised from the teas is for Burrough Green Church. The gate money is £5 per adult to include all three gardens and children are free.

CALLING ALL BIRDWATCHERS

Spotted Flycatchers - do you have this increasingly rare bird breeding in your garden? Participate in our survey!



Last year many Cambridgeshire community and parish newsletters, magazines and websites helped with a county-wide survey of Spotted Flycatchers. These are attractive little migrant birds which are summer visitors to village gardens and churchyards. Although they breed with us, they spend ten months of the year travelling between here and their wintering grounds in Southern Africa. This is an increasingly dangerous journey for them, and sadly they are in deep decline. Widespread losses amounted to a 50% decline during 1995-2010, continuing a 90% decline since 1970

Only some fifty pairs remain breeding in Cambridgeshire, so it's now quite a rare bird, but most rural villages still have a pair or two. The Cambridgeshire Bird Club is again running a survey this year to find and monitor nesting pairs, and it's almost certain that there will be additional pairs in our villages of which we are not aware. Do you have flycatchers in your garden? Please let the Bird Club know.

Glebe House Common Road Brinkley CB8 OSN

Dear Brinkley Resident

I am writing as a brief response to the natural concern being expressed locally concerning the land behind Old School Lane in Brinkley being assessed by East Cambs D.C. for suitability for inclusion in their Local Plan. (Site reference Site/03/02)

As the land owner, I can confirm that no planning application for houses has been submitted for this site and I do not intend to submit one in the near future. I have submitted details of this site to East Cambs in response for their call for sites to highlight that the land is available for development should the need arise in the village for a mix of starter homes and houses in the future.

The alarming figure of 81 houses has arisen as the council have applied a general multiplier per acre for housing development which is not specific to this site. The lower 3 acres of paddock is not suitable for houses.

I wish to make it clear that the paddock nearest the road would only be considered for development if a need was established for a mix of starter and family homes in this area.

We have lived in the village for 50 years and intend to continue living here and have no intention of destroying the village we love, but we do accept the need for more houses to be built nationally.

The month of June brings us many festivals, Day of Pentecost (Whit Sunday), 4th June, Trinity Sunday, 11th June, Day of Thanksgiving for Holy Communion Christi). June 15th. the summer (Corpus solstice (or estival solstice), known also as midsummer, June 21st , the feast of St Alban (first martyr of Britain c.250), June22nd and the feast of Ethledreda (Foundress and Abbess of Ely c.678), June 23rd

Etheldreda was the daughter of Anna, king of East Anglia, and was born, probably, at Exning, near Newmarket. At an early age she was married (c.652) to Tondberht, ealdorman of the South Gyrwas, but she remained a virgin. On his death, c.655, she retired to the Isle of Ely, her dowry. In 660, for political reasons, she was married to Egfrith, the young king of Northumbria who was then only 15 years old, and several years younger than her. He agreed that she should remain a virgin, as in her previous marriage, but 12 years later he wished their marital relationship to be normal. Etheldreda, advised and aided by Wilfred, Bishop of Northumbria, refused. Egfrith offered bribes in vain. Etheldreda left him and became a nun at Coldingham under her aunt Ebbe (672) and founded a double monastery at Ely in 673.

Etheldreda restored an old church at Ely, reputedly destroyed by Penda, pagan king of the Mercians, and built her monastery on the site of what is now Ely Cathedral, After its restoration in 970 by Ethelwold it became the richest abbey in England except for Glastonbury, Etheldreda died c.680 from a tumour on the neck, as the result of the plague which also killed several of her nuns. For centuries, Etheldreda's shrine was the focus for vast numbers of medieval pilgrims. It was destroyed in 1541, but a slate in the Cathedral marks the spot where it stood. The 23rd June is still kept as major festival in the Cathedral. Some relics are alleged to be in St Etheldreda's Church, Ely Place, London (where the Bishops of Ely formerly had their London residence). Work on the present Cathedral began in the 11th century under the leadership of Abbot Simeon, and the monastic church became a cathedral in 1109.

Eternal God,

who bestowed such grace upon your servant Etheldreda

that she gave herself wholly to the life of prayer and to the service of your true religion: grant that we, like her,

may so live our lives on earth seeking your kingdom that by your guiding

we may be joined to the glorious fellowship of your saints; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
