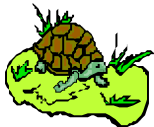
ROAD CLOSURE IN CARLTON

Recycling - Paper Caddy Collection - Carlton

South Cambridgeshire District Council is changing the way used paper is collected from residents for recycling.

From 11 December, residents won't need to use their caddies to recycle paper anymore.

From that date, residents should place their used paper directly into their blue wheelie bins instead. This used paper will still be recycled after being sorted from other materials at our facility near Waterbeach.

Residents can keep their caddy to use for anything they like. Alternatively, they can be recycled by being dropped off at the nearest household waste recycling centre. They should not be placed into wheelie bins.

The decision to withdraw the paper caddy service was taken at South Cambridgeshire District Council's Cabinet meeting in September. The decision will save taxpayers money and simplify the recycling process for residents.

Because of this upcoming change, the District Council will not be delivering any new paper caddies. If they are lost or stolen before 11 December, residents can begin putting paper in their blue bin.

After 11 December, residents can keep their caddies and use them however they wish. Alternatively, they can be taken to a household waste recycling centre for recycling. They should not be placed into wheelie bins. More information can be found here: <https://www.scambs.gov.uk/recycling>

**CAMBRIDGESHIRE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE**

FIREWORKS and bonfire night can be plenty of fun for all of the family to enjoy; and going to an organised firework display instead of holding one at home can be a great way of supporting your local community. If you plan on using fireworks or lighting a bonfire at your own home however, please ensure you consider our safety advice below:

**Fireworks:**

- Only buy fireworks marked BS 7114
- Light fireworks at arm's length using a taper, stand well back and never go back to a lit firework
- Never throw fireworks or put them in your pockets or clothing
- Light sparklers one at a time wearing gloves, and place used sparklers in a bucket of water
- Never give sparklers to children under five
- It is illegal to sell fireworks to someone under the age of 18 or to light fireworks in a public place
- For more information on Firework Safety, visit: [www.hse.gov.uk](http://www.hse.gov.uk)
- Always consider animals and wildlife nearby when holding a firework display
- Always consider the location of a bonfire or firework display, smoke drifting near or on to surrounding roads can have devastating consequences.

**Bonfires:**

- Do not light bonfires in unsuitable weather conditions, particularly when windy
- Do not leave bonfires unattended
- Keep a bucket of water or a hosepipe handy just in case
- Build bonfires well clear of buildings, garden sheds, fences and hedges
- Never use flammable liquids to start the fire
- Never burn dangerous rubbish such as aerosols, paint, foam furniture, rubber tyres, batteries, etc
- Before you light the bonfire, check that children and animals are not hiding inside and are a safe distance away.

**MARSH MAIL: News from Linton Village College**

Education news has been awash with challenges faced by schools. There have been a number of high profile campaigns, including [www.schoolsjustwannahavefunds.org](http://www.schoolsjustwannahavefunds.org) to address endemic funding issues that are affecting our ability to deliver the excellent education that all children deserve.

After months of consultation, the National Funding Formula was published in September. Despite a commitment to tackle inherent inequalities that saw schools in Cambridgeshire being grossly underfunded on the basis of historic formulae, the indicative figures demonstrate little real improvement. Linton Village College stands to gain a nominal amount over the coming years. Unfortunately, much of this is wiped out by real-term cost increases, meanwhile caps to protect the funding of better-off counties maintain existing inequities. If we were positioned over the Essex border, we would see around £105,000 more in our annual budget; if we were in Greater Manchester we'd be over a million pounds better off; in Hackney we would receive an extra £2.5 million.

Making the books balance is becoming increasingly more difficult. We are keen to maintain a holistic and enriching learning experience at LVC, avoiding a narrowing of the curriculum that other schools in the area have resorted to, or having to cut back on much-needed pastoral and learning support, especially as access to other services are under significant pressure.

We are really grateful to the school community for supporting us with fundraising. The Chestnut Tree at West Wratting raised over £1,300 from donations from their beer festival at the start of term which has been committed to improving IT resources. We are awaiting a final total of the monies raised from our annual sponsored walk which will help to update school facilities.

The Friends of LVC have recruited a new Chair and Secretary to the committee and we are thrilled that this important source of support will continue. THERE'S STILL TIME TO GET YOUR GARDEN UNDER CONTROL FOR FREE

Ex-service personnel living in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough can call the Green Aiders to clear their garden this autumn.



The Green Aiders is a free, one-off garden clearance service run by community charity Groundwork Cambridgeshire & Peterborough, and there is still funding for more veterans and their families to benefit from the scheme.

It is funded by The Royal British Legion through its External Grants programme and is available to vulnerable or disabled ex-Service personnel or their spouses, partners, widows/widowers, children or dependants aged 65 plus.

Through a one-off visit, dedicated volunteers led by Groundwork staff make gardens more manageable, safer and more pleasant to spend time in. At the same time, clearing overgrown gardens makes it harder for criminals or fraudsters to identify occupants as potential targets.

Gary's father James recently benefited from a Green Aiders visit. Gary says: "Dad is happier now - the fact that someone did something for him makes a difference. Green Aiders is the only gardening support that he's had and they've done really well for him. It's made me feel better, too, as I don't need to worry - I know it's under control now."

Head of Social Policy & Grant Giving at the Legion, Steven Baynes, said: "We're pleased to have awarded over £43,000 to Groundwork. The grant demonstrates the Legion's continued commitment to working with other organisations to provide the best support possible to our beneficiaries. It will also enable Groundwork to use its expertise to make a real difference to those veterans struggling with the upkeep of their gardens."
