MARSH MAIL - News from Linton Village College

This term we mark the 80th anniversary of Linton Village College. The school first opened its doors in 1937 with a much more modest building and staff. While the Art Deco architecture remains intact, a great deal has changed. It was lovely to meet ex-students and staff to appreciate their memories of the College.

As part of the preparations for LVC@80, we have explored archive material including historic photographs and documents. We have discovered fascinating items including strongly-worded parental letters of complaint penned over 60 years ago, reports of supernatural activity and some outrageous bus incident reports.

One of the most poignant pieces was a war-time letter capturing a teacher's commitment to the profession, despite offers of employment to support the war effort because of his staunch belief that: 'there is a job of work of equal importance to be done right here on the spot; to plan for a better world when once the struggle is over'.

Written in February 1942, the author urges the then Warden of the College to focus on 'the inner nature of the child'. The teacher's 27 proposals include bringing up a generation that will be free from hate and fear and to focus on developing children's character and initiative.

75 years on, we still strive to encourage this kind of holistic education at LVC. Children are encouraged to be curious, reflective and independent, to take responsibility and be ambitious in their learning and lives. Another of the school's values, caring, is symbolised not only in the Linton Learner logo but by the sculpture outside the school's original entrance.

In addition to the tea, cake and music, the anniversary celebrations included the official unveiling of a commemorative mosaic which captures the Linton Learner attributes that we value and grow in the school community. This piece of collaborative art work, created by every student in a year group, serves as a lasting contribution to the school's heritage.

Thank you to everyone who has supported the anniversary celebrations and reinforced what is so special about our Village College.

HOARDING

Hoarding is a serious and complex issue that goes far beyond simple untidiness. It



is a recognised mental health condition requiring careful treatment. Hoarding is a widespread issue affecting between 2% and 3% of the population - approximately 1.2 million people in the UK.

People who display hoarding behaviours excessively collect items such as newspapers, books, clothing, and in some cases rubbish, rotten food and animals, resulting in unmanageable amounts of clutter. This in turn can cause serious health problems, structural damage, pest infestations and serious risk of fire. Since 2014, we have engaged with over 50 households in South Cambridgeshire alone. In more serious cases, it can sometimes lead to emotionally distressing enforced clearances. People who display hoarding behaviours need help to learn how to change the way they think about acquiring, purchasing, or collecting as well as how they relate to their belongings.

Training is underway and we start with basic drill, an understanding of the Air Training Corps and the RAF before moving on to radio and expedition training. Once the first-class cadet qualification is completed then activities such as shooting and flying become available.

With a mix of camps, station visits and flying it has been a very busy summer. As the weather turns we keep just as busy. A mix of aviation studies, sport and personal projects are just a few items on the schedule for the coming months.

**OCTOBER BULLETIN FROM CAMBRIDGESHIRE**  
**FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE**

Winter is upon us and as the colder months draw in, we begin using our fires, burners and chimneys once again to warm our homes. Chimney Fires continue to be a common occurrence in home fires in the winter months. We experience an average of 81 chimney fires a year in Cambridgeshire alone.

To ensure you keep your home safe from fire, follow our Top Tips below:

- Whatever fire you have or fuel you burn it is vitally important to have your chimney swept to avoid a build-up of ash and soot

- Avoid burning resinous woods (that quickly build up soot)
- Only burn fuels suitable for your burner (eg: never burn anything other than wood in a wood burner)
- Do not overload the grate/ appliance
- Do not bank fires too high and remember to let them burn out well before you go to bed
- Check the hearth, floor and furnishings near the fire for hot sparks/embers
- Do not place objects on or over the mantelpiece which cause you to stand too close to the fire in order to reach them
- Use a fire/spark guard to prevent accidental fires and make sure it has the kite mark or conforms to British/ European standards
- Inspect your chimney breast, particularly the roof space. Make sure it is sound and sparks/fumes cannot escape through cracks or broken bricks
- For each slow burning period, there should follow a quick burn to dry out unwanted tar/creosote deposits and to warm up the chimney again
- At the end of each burning season and at least once during the season the entire system should be cooled and thoroughly cleaned to maintain top performance.

Also ensure that Wood and Multi-Fuel burners are installed and regularly maintained by a qualified and competent engineer. You can refer to [www.solidfuel.co.uk](http://www.solidfuel.co.uk) for further advice and information.

Most importantly, ALWAYS fit a smoke alarm that carries the kite mark or British Standard Number 5446 - test your alarm weekly by pressing the test button and know the life of your battery.

ALWAYS also install a Carbon Monoxide (CO) alarm in the room where the burner is installed.

The Wadlow Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund is seeking applications from local organisations and community based projects which contribute to the wellbeing of the local areas of:

Hello Everyone!

It is lovely to be here with you; my family and I are very grateful for the warm welcome we have received. It was wonderful to meet so many of you at my licensing service and (although it hasn't happened yet as I write this) at the Vicar's Garden Party.

I would like to thank all those who have contributed so much over the last few years whilst the position has been vacant, and importantly for indicating that you will continue to do so!

We have come from Stamford in Lincolnshire but prior to that spent many years living on the Romney Marsh in Kent and it was in one of these small rural churches that I heard God's calling to be a Priest. Of course a calling to Priesthood isn't the only thing you might experience in Church (but beware you just might!); many times our churches are places where people are drawn for the holy space they offer to contemplate whatever may be going on in their lives.
