PLASTIC POLLUTION

For those of you who saw the final episode of David Attenborough's Blue Planet II you will have seen the devastation caused by Plastic Pollution. I watched this episode with dismay and have since started to research the subject in more detail.

In the last ten years we have produced more plastic than during the whole of the last century

- We have produced a whopping 8.3 billion metric tons of plastics since the 1950s
- 50 percent of the plastic we use, we use just once and throw away. This includes disposable cutlery, drinking straws, coffee cups, food packaging and plastic bags.
- 79% of this plastic has ended up in landfills or the natural environment, including our oceans. Just 9% is recycled.
- It's estimated that 6.4 million tonnes of litter enter the sea annually via rivers, blown from landfill sites or as a result of industrial leakage.
- A plastic bottle, sent to landfill or left as litter, will take over 450 years to degrade. A Plastic bag can take anywhere from 100-1000 years to degrade.

Theresa May will commit the UK to eliminating all avoidable plastic waste by 2042, waste such as the carrier bags, food packaging and disposable plastic straws that litter the country and pollute the seas could be abolished.

In the meantime each one of us can make a difference by reducing our plastic consumption, choosing alternative materials where possible and ensuring anything that can be reused or recycled is.

- Take a reusable coffee cup instead of using a disposable one that cannot be recycled
- Carry your own water bottle and refill when required.
- Always use a bag for life at the supermarket
- Refuse plastic drinking straws and take your own stainless-steel straws that can be reused
- Say no to plastic cutlery and carry some with you
- Switch to a degradable bamboo toothbrush
- Get your milk delivered in glass bottles
- Avoid any unnecessary packaging

MARSH MAIL News from Linton Village College

One of the most memorable moments of the spring term at LVC (heavy snow aside) has been the College's production of 'The Crucible'. The play was an absolute triumph and showcased incredibly accomplished performances by our students. The high standard of compelling acting was very impressive for an 11-16 College, especially given the mature themes in Arthur Miller's play.

Performing a script that centres on the Salem Witch Trials in 1690s Massachusetts certainly stretched the students' dramatic skills as well as their historical knowledge. Miller wrote this as an allegory for McCarthyism in 1950s America. This rich political undercurrent offered powerful messages for members of the audience and cast with some very emotional and poignant scenes, demonstrating the spell-binding power of the Arts.

The cast and crew developed in all sorts of ways in the lead up to show nights. Team work, commitment, confidence and resilience, to name a few of the aspects of personal growth.

Historically, when discussing subject option choices with students as they make decisions about their future studies, a number of them have shared the view that the Arts subjects will provide light relief from their other options, or even, sadly, that they are hobbies rather than academic courses. It is credit to the Arts Faculty that these misconceptions are not widely held at LVC. In recent years we've seen a dramatic increase in numbers of students opting for Arts subjects.

With current technological advances it's arguably those that are most creative in their fields that will exceed the functions of automation. Additionally, the creative industries provide a significant proportion of employment opportunities and £84 billion annually to the UK economy. Any student (or adult) that has experienced the pains-taking commitment of learning lines and perfecting a performance, hours of instrumental practice or artistic experimentation will appreciate the discipline and dedication required to excel in creative arts.

I was thoroughly proud of the achievements of students and staff to achieve such stunning performances. 'The Crucible' was an example of the power and beauty of the Arts and an important reminder of the importance of enriching, educational opportunities.

THE EASTER STORY

I grew up in a Christian tradition that took every word of the bible literally (pretty hard to do as parts are contradictory!) and to question God was deemed disrespectful. I now hold a rather different stance seeing literal truths (the love of God for all and the life, death and resurrection of Jesus) and relative truths (to the era, to the situation) within the bible. I also think God positively likes being questioned, She/He can handle it! Just look to Jesus's Parables they positively encourage thought and challenge. And then we have Jesus questioning words on the cross to God' Why have you forsaken me?' as he carries the sins and hurts of the world distancing him from God and it is painful literally and emotionally.

During the Lent course questions arose about Jesus's death one being 'If Jesus knew he was going to die and let it happen when he could have stopped it was this in fact a form of suicide?'

To my mind Jesus foresaw his rejection and crucifixion but also the final outcome of the hope and reality of his resurrection. Death and sin are overcome, there is hope earthly and eternal for us all. So rather like a soldier on a battlefield, or a parent who pushes a pram out of the way of a car, death might be probable, but life is given in self sacrifice. Out of purpose, out of love for others. Jesus dies so all might live.

The taking of one's own life can come from impossible pain of self and for hurts of the world which become too much to bear. An eleven year old once asked me 'What happens when those who take their own life die?' I said I believe Jesus has felt their pain, knowing that life had been hard for them and welcomes them with open arms. More simply I could have said 'I believe Jesus runs to meet them'.

It is in the vulnerable that we meet Jesus and Jesus meets us, right there at the foot of the cross. Not in power and strength but in gentle, amazing, everlasting love.
