BURROUGH GREEN PARISH COUNCIL TAX PRECEPT 2018-2019

We have calculated that our precept request this year must increase by £774.06. This would equate to an increase of £3.77 per household over the year, or 31p per month. This was agreed at the January 2018 meeting by Full Council.

The justification for this much needed increase is that we need to build up our diminished reserves for future Community Projects, and the need to provide Data Protection Services due to the Government introducing the new General Data Protection Regulations in May 2018. This increase will show on your 2018/19 Council Tax Bill.

CATS DEATHS ON CARLTON GREEN ROAD

Hello All

My name is Karina and I live at 171 Carlton Green since June 2002. 15 years of peaceful existence with my 2 dogs, 3 cats and 20 chickens.

However, 2017 was the worst year of my life. Five, yes, 5, cats were killed by speeding cars on the road in front of my house: (the cats were non-concurrent). The first cat was 11 years old and was murdered and found in front of no. 167; the second cat was 2 years old and I did actually watch the entire episode. The cat heard me talking to the dogs on the start of their walk and run from the field to the gate and under a car; (the cat is at fault, and the car is at fault). The third cat was a new kitten and I found him dead in front of my verge. He was 6 months and 1 day. Then I adopted twins and again one was killed in front of no. 172 at 6 months and 2 weeks, and the last one was murdered on Christmas Eve, in front of no. 169. Two, cats escaped the culling, they are 8 and 7 years old. All the cats died during daylight hours.

About 8 months ago I placed 2 signs, SLOW, CATS CROSSING. It made no difference. Apparently, Carlton Green Road is 60 miles per hour speed area. How ridiculous is this?

I raised the subject with Stephen Roberts and Kate Homan and both tried to convince me calmly and logically that the council will not take any action or invest any funds in an area of 7 cottages. However, nobody yet talked to the council. Apart from me. A few years back, before the killing of five cats I rang Highways and asked if we could have 30 mph signage. The answer was 'No', because people do not observe road speeds. Now how stupid a reply is this? People do not observe many rules and consequently many of them are in prison. Probably not enough of them.

To conclude, I would like to ask all of you, your teenage children, friends of teenage children, visitors, contractors, delivery couriers, etc, to SLOW DOWN. Please, please, please.

MARSH MAIL - News from Linton Village College

With the cabinet reshuffle in January came the announcement of Justine Greening's resignation and a new Secretary of State for Education: Damian Hinds. During my two years as Principal at LVC, there have been three different ministers in this top position. Nicky Morgan was known for her focus on character education, Justine Greening for using schooling as a vehicle for social mobility. We are still awaiting details of Mr Hinds's vision and values.

In many ways, it is great that since Blair's 'Education, education, education' pledge in his 1997 speech, schooling has become a more pressing priority for the government.

However, Greening's exit signals yet more change for the profession. Given the amount of turbulence since 2010, teachers are understandably anxious about what policies the new Secretary of State may introduce to make his mark.

In recent years there has been substantial profile given to ministerial priorities including free/grammar schools, free breakfasts/lunches and school funding, to name a few. This has been against a backdrop of significant government-driven reform that has seen the removal of National Curriculum levels, new, more challenging, primary and GCSE testing and a hike in accountability.

The doorstop manifesto released by the Headteachers' Roundtable, a national non-political educational think tank of which I am a member, has the following guiding principles:

- 1. The pace of educational change should not be affected by party politics;
- 2. Schools must be able to offer all their pupils the chance to thrive;
- 3. Educational change should begin by identifying the desired outcomes for children;
- 4. Prioritising high quality teaching & learning and the curriculum will lead to world class assessment and accountability;
- 5. The teaching profession should be centrally involved in developing future education policy.

In 2012, Mr Hinds published an All-Party Parliamentary report in which he stated a need to "focus first on quality of teachers and teaching". I hope that his 18 years in the hospitality industry has given him a disposition to listen to and serve the education community.

People are incredibly important in education, but it is children, not political preferences, that need to be at the centre of education policy.

The Right Vintage

February and soon with it Lent seems to have come around so quickly! The good thing is that any New Year's resolutions/ determinations made can be reinvigorated or for those who don't make them a good opportunity arises in Lent to reflect and take a spiritual health check.

I have been reflecting this week on the Wedding of Cana, where the wine runs out at a large wedding feast and Jesus performs one of his first miracles. With not a supermarket in sight, social disaster is looming, and you can just imagine the servants panic as they run out of wine, but Mary Jesus's mother in effect says 'Don't panic! Take what concerns you to Jesus' and then crucially 'Do what he tells you'.

Because when we take things that concern us (ourselves, those around us, the World) to God we need to let go trustingly and then listen for how we might need to play our part. This might be in terms of seemingly physical inaction (prayer, meditation, laying things down) or action (giving our time, our treasures, taking the first steps towards reconciliation).

At the wedding Jesus performs an action, a miracle, beyond what was desired or expected. He turns the water into wine and not just an OK wine but a vintage variety, the very best of wines! But they needed to bring the problem to him, trust him and respond to his direction (fetch the water, listen to instructions).

Lent is a good time then to do a 'spiritual health check' to consider the closeness of our relationship with God, are we taking everything to God in prayer, and is a response (action or stillness) needed from us to bring the best 'vintage' of an answer?

May a closer walk and talk with God this Lent bring 'shalom' peace and wholeness to you all,
