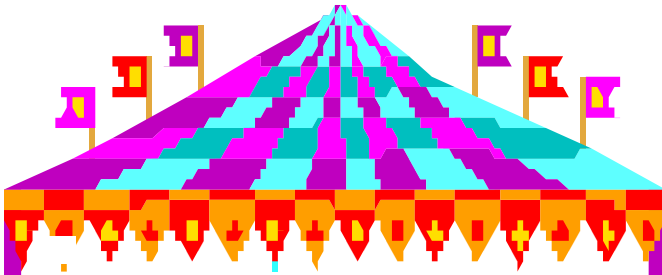

**BRINKLEY DEFIBRILLATOR**

A defibrillator has now been installed and is up and running in the old phone box on the High Street in Brinkley, opposite the Memorial Hall.

The defibrillator is fully automated and clear spoken instructions will be given when the unit is being used.

If you are with or come across someone who has had a cardiac arrest, it's vital to call 999 first and start CPR. If you are with someone else send them to get the defibrillator and the ambulance service will instruct you upon their return. Please do not leave a patient alone to collect a defibrillator unless instructed to by the ambulance service (British Heart Foundation guidelines).

**BRINKLEY PARISH COUNCIL ARE LOOKING FOR**  
**NEW COUNCILLORS**

**Brinkley Parish Councillors:**

- Are available for PC meetings, held approximately five times a year after 7pm in the evenings.
- Undertake any actions delegated to them from meetings.
- Receive and respond to PC emails in between meetings.

**Can You Be Co-Opted Or Elected As A Councillor?**  
**You must be:**

- a British Citizen of the Commonwealth or the European Union;
- Be 18 years of age or over
- during that 12-month period resided in the council area; or
- Have during the whole of the 12 months preceding that day occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the council area; or
- have during that same period had your principal or only place of work in the council area; or
- You can also satisfy the criteria to be elected if you have lived in the council area or within 3 miles of it for the whole of the 12 months preceding the "relevant day".

**You cannot stand as a Parish Councillor if you:**

- are subject of a bankruptcy restriction order or interim order
- have, within five years before the day of the election/co-option, been convicted in the United Kingdom of any offence and have had a sentence of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) for a period of over three months without the option of a fine
- Work for the council you want to become a councillor for (but you can work for other local authorities, including the principal authorities that represent the same area).

**MARSH MAIL News from Linton Village College**

Opening LVC for community use is one of the special hallmarks of our heritage. Henry Morris, the Chief Education Officer in Cambridgeshire who founded the Village College movement after the first world war, had a vision for schools being at the heart of their local communities and for 'raising the school leaving age to 90'. His legacy still lives on in the ethos and character of the schools that he established with the intention of making rural schools at the heart of their localities.

It was a great privilege to host Linton's seventh Book Festival at the College. It is always such an inspiring event and special celebration of reading. The buzz of children listening and meeting authors and engaging with the array of activities is great witness, as is the multi-generational attendance of local families and visitors to the Festival.

Morris's commitment to life-long, enriching learning is borne out through a Memorial Trust which was set up in his memory in 1964, three years after his death. Students aged 13-19 can apply for funding from the Trust to fund projects with a purpose. This year LVC students have been successful in securing grants for trips to the Lake District and Berlin.

We are keen for the College to continue to play an important role in the life of the local community beyond formal schooling. It is great to see the school's buildings, grounds and facilities continue to benefit local residents as well as our students. Most weekends, even those not hosting exceptional events such as the Book Festival, see the school packed with fixtures and other activities, as is the case after school. Having Linton Granta Playgroup on site and other community users such as the Linton's Air Training Corps adds another dimension to our learning community. Our adult education programme and sports centre facilities are two integral parts of our wider provision, as is making the College available for lettings. New websites have recently been launched to publicise our classes and facilities. I hope that this important aspect of the school's culture continues to flourish.

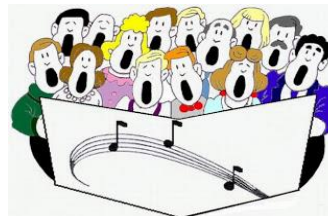
I have represented Cambridgeshire County in the under 18s and ladies events and reached a high of 17 in the UK out of 2000 in the under 18s age group.

**BULLETIN FROM CAMBRIDGESHIRE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE**

As the weather brightens up and the sunshine starts brightening our weeks, we welcome the longer, brighter nights and the opportunity to enjoy summer days and nights in the garden.

When powering up your BBQ's and putting out the garden furniture for the summer season, be sure to take note of our top tips below to ensure you have a fun and safe summer in the garden.

- If cooking outdoors, always check barbeques over after winter storage, keep them on level ground and ensure they are sited away from sheds, fences, overhanging foliage and property
- Keep children and garden games well away from the cooking area and never leave the barbecue unattended
- If you have a bonfire, build it well away from buildings, tents or other flammable objects and make sure it is properly out when you leave
- When out in the countryside, extinguish cigarettes properly and dispose of them responsibly - never throw a lit cigarette into a field or wooded area.
- Don't forget to stay safe around our county's waterways and if you see someone in trouble in water, call 999 immediately with clear details of your location
- When out camping or using a tent, never use candles inside or nearby and always discourage smoking nearby. Never cook inside a tent

**ARE YOU UNDER 25?**

**COULD YOU USE UP TO £500 ON A PROJECT?**

The Elizabeth March Charity has funds to support an educational project for anyone under 25 **living in Brinkley**. But we need **you** to contact us and tell us why we should be funding your plans.

This is how it works:

- You explain what you would like the money for and how you intend to spend it. The application must be in writing and include how much money you need.
- The Trustees consider the application. We decide whether we can support you and how much we can afford to provide. This could be up to a maximum of £500.
- We provide the funds and you complete your project.
- You send us details of how you spent the money - we expect you to provide evidence of what you did with it.

We can look at all sorts of projects, but they need to have some educational purpose. We have helped a range of overseas travel projects, provided money to help buy special equipment for A-level studies and helped with the costs of attending courses and events with the Guides. If you are applying to an apprenticeship scheme, or to a university, the award could help towards the purchase of books, IT, material, equipment and so on. If you are not sure whether your idea is suitable you can email the Trustees (Briony Gimson, Belinda Hull, Hannah Pinnock and Judith Haste) at [elizabethmarchbrinkley@gmail.com](mailto:elizabethmarchbrinkley@gmail.com) before you apply.

We can consider applications at any time, but preferably by 1<sup>st</sup> July 2018 as our resources are limited, so the sooner you get in touch the sooner we can let you know whether we can help. The Trustees will make their decision by the end of August 2018.

### **Sweet Trinity**

I love chocolate! So describing the mystery of the Trinity (the three aspects of God) as like plain, white and milk chocolate, all being chocolate (God) but all still individual in appearance and taste, works really well for me, but apparently using this analogy might be heretical! But somehow I don't think God minds, I am sure God smiles at our human attempts to describe the indescribable nature of God!

Traditionally the Trinity is described as 'God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit'.

I like how the Inclusive Language Lord's Prayer from New Zealand speaks to the wider nature of God and our relationship response to it:
