**REPORTING NON-EMERGENCIES ONLINE**

Non-emergency situations can now be reported to the police online if people would rather do so than call 101.

In October last year Cambridgeshire Constabulary re-launched their website with added functionality to report non-emergencies via specially designed forms or a live webchat.

The live webchat option enables people to communicate directly with a member of staff in the control room, just as would be the case when calling 101. Online forms are processed in the same way as a call and the person reporting can expect a response within 24 hours.

Due to the high level of demand there are often queues when calling 101. Reporting online is quick, easy and free of charge.

Superintendent James Sutherland said: "In the digital age people are doing more and more online. I'm pleased that our website now has increased capability to allow people to contact us in this way.

"The system went through a thorough testing process and has been used successfully thousands of times since being introduced.

"Feedback from a recent survey suggested that some people wanted to communicate directly with a person rather than submitting an online form. The webchat function allows people to do exactly that.

"Reports submitted online are treated in the same way as when people call 101 and will receive the same outcome."

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**MARSH MAIL -News from Linton Village College**

Widespread coverage of institutionalised sexism continues in the media spotlight. Amongst the stories of sexual abuse and harassment, the coverage has also highlighted inequalities in the treatment of women and gender stereotypes that persist, despite significant societal progress to tackle them.

Everyday sexism in schools has been the focus of recent research by the government, revealing some shocking findings. A report, published last year by Parliament's Women and Equalities Select Committee, outlined evidence that nearly 60 per cent of girls and young women aged 13-21 said that they had faced some form of sexual harassment at school or college within the previous year. It is disturbing that there were so many victims of unpleasant and unwanted language and behaviour, and that this kind of conduct continues in the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

At LVC we continue to address these issues through our PSHE curriculum and seek to tackle and address casual sexism that can be perceived by students as 'a joke'. We also continue to work on perceptions of careers aspirations through our information, advice and guidance and opportunities. Our March science week programme at LVC features talks from female STEM (science, technology, engineering and maths) leaders, amongst other engaging events to showcase the subject.

Delivering a curriculum that reflects women's achievements starts in our partner primary schools with the study of influential figures, such as Mary Seacole, and exploring parents' careers in non-gender-stereotyped professions, such as female surgeons.

It has been great to see children of both sexes flourishing in our inaugural dance production, 'Ignite', last month, and smashing gender stereotypes. Solo performances by males and females and an all boy dance troupe were fabulous. Meanwhile, our Under 16 girls' basketball team celebrated the title of district champions.

The introduction of an LGBT+ group at LVC for students to openly discuss issues relating to gender is an example of the safe and accepting environment that we seek to foster and support.

It is essential that all children, regardless of sex and gender, are able to thrive, flourish and achieve their potential at school and in life, without fear of harassment or limitation.

February is always an exciting month as the plans for the year start to take shape. Training for our sector and wing field days is coming together nicely and we expect to do well in both competitions. As we move into March things really start to move up a gear.

Firstly we have cross country and team sports trials. There are a series of competitive wing wide trials and I expect that many of our cadets will make the wing football, rugby and hockey teams. This is followed by an array of courses; The ELA qualification is a nationally recognised certificate in health and safety training as well as Junior NCO courses; our newly promoted corporals spend a weekend on an RAF base learning how to lead a team and help keep uniform and drill standards high on the squadron.
