On the 3 August 1914, Britain's Foreign Minister, Sir Edward Grey, was looking out his office window. It was dusk, and gas lights were being lit along London's Mall, leading to Buckingham Palace, when he remarked to a friend, "The lamps are going out all over Europe, we shall not see

them lit again in our lifetime". Britain was about to be plunged into the darkness of the First World War, and it would be four long years before Britain and Europe would again experience the light of peace.

On November 11<sup>th</sup> over 1,000 towns are participating in various ways to commemorate and remember the end of the war and the many millions that were killed or came home dreadfully wounded.

The event will also commemorate the army of men and women on the home front who, often in dangerous and exhausting conditions, underpinned the war effort keeping the wheels of industry turning, bringing harvest home and ensuring the nation did not starve. 1,000 pipers will start the day at 06:00 playing the traditional Scottish lament played at the end of a battle. Over 1,000 Beacons of Light will be lit at 19:00 to symbolize an end to the darkness of war and a return to the light of peace, and at 19:05 over 1,000 churches and cathedrals will ring their bells in celebration of Peace.

It begins at 6am on November 11<sup>th</sup>, 2018 with lone pipers playing Battle's O'er, a traditional tune played after a battle, outside every cathedral in the country. At the same time, pipers everywhere will be playing the same tune in their local communities around the world. The tribute is being organised with the assistance of the Glasgow-based College of Piping, local pipe bands around the world, the Air Training Corps and the Army Cadet Force.

#### BEACONS OF LIGHT

At 6.55pm buglers will sound the Last Post at more than 1,000 locations, where at 7pm WW1 Beacons of Light will be lit, signifying the light of peace that emerged from the darkness of war.

#### RINGING OUT FOR PEACE

Ringing Out for Peace is part of Battle's Over,

At 7.05pm church and cathedral bells will be Ringing Out for Peace, organised with the assistance of the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, the representative body for groups who ring bells in the English tradition with rope and wheel.

<u>CARLTON</u> is taking part in the national 'Beacons of Light' ceremony to commemorate the hundredth anniversary of the end of the First World War. Ours will be in the churchyard. There will be a very short service in the church starting at 6.30pm, following which the village will hold its Act of Remembrance, lit with lanterns at the War Memorial at 6.45pm. The beacon will then be lit nearby at 7pm. Do please join us either in the church or a short time later at the War Memorial.

BRINKLEY - So many of us have family members that were involved in this conflict, at home or abroad. We wanted to participate and are inviting you to join us.

Come up to Red Lion Brinkley after 6:30pm - we'll have some hot drinks or soup available to take around to our back paddock. At 6.50pm we're planning to read out the names of local people that never returned from the War, and 'The Tribute to the Millions', written by Bruno Peak, Pageantmaster of this national remembrance event. We will be lighting our Bonfire Beacon at 7.00pm which should be able to be seen all the way to Cambridge and south of here.



ODOUR IN BRINKLEY HIGH STREET

For about the last 10 months there has been an unpleasant smell in the High Street in the vicinity of White Hart Cottage. If anyone can help with either of these two issues and rid the village of this nuisance I would be very pleased to hear from you as I will maintain contact and keep the pressure on the authorities. FIREWORKS and bonfire night can be plenty of fun for all the family to enjoy and going to an organised firework display instead of holding one at home can be a great way of supporting your local community.

If you do plan on using fireworks or lighting a bonfire at your own home however, please ensure you consider our safety advice below:

Fireworks:

Only buy fireworks marked BS 7114

• Light fireworks at arm's length using a taper,

stand well back and never go back to a lit firework
Never throw fireworks or put them in your pockets or clothing

• Light sparklers one at a time wearing gloves, and place used sparklers in a bucket of water

Never give sparklers to children under five
It is illegal to sell fireworks to someone under

the age of 18 or to light fireworks in a public place
For more information on Firework Safety,

visit: www.hse.gov.uk

Bonfires:

• Do not light bonfires in unsuitable weather conditions, particularly when windy

Do not leave bonfires unattended

• Keep a bucket of water or a hosepipe handy just in case

• Build bonfires well clear of buildings, garden sheds, fences and hedges

 Never use flammable liquids to start the fire
 Never burn dangerous rubbish such as aerosols, paint, foam furniture, rubber tyres, batteries, etc

• Before you light the bonfire, check that children and animals are not hiding inside and are a safe distance away

#### A Time of Remembrance

November always strikes me as a pensive month as we remember both those we have loved at All Souls Memorial Services and those who gave and continue to give their lives for our freedoms at Remembrance Services.

This is of course a particularly special year marking 100 years of Remembrance and the ending of WW1. A number of our churches have a Tommies Silhouette in them, the image of the 'unforgotten soldier' is always a poignant one. My great grandfather a private in the Sussex Regiment died on the battlefields in November 1916 aged 27 just one of millions of casualties, husbands, sons, fathers.... It must all have looked so bleak and helpless.

On 4 August 1918 King George V called a National Day of Prayer. One hundred days later the war ended. On 23 May 1940 with allied armies trapped on beaches King George V1 called for a National Day of Prayer and apparently congregations overflowed, the same day 800 vessels answered the call to evacuate Dunkirk.

When things look and feel helpless we need more than ourselves, we need the Divine and we need each other. Let us never be afraid to ask of either. They shall grow not old as we that are left grow old.

Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning, We will remember them...
