CAMBRIDGE FIRE & RESCUE BULLETIN

Public urged to stay fire safe this summer

Cambridgeshire residents have been urged to stay fire safe when outdoors over the summer.

The weather so far has not been as warm as forecast earlier in the year. However with high temperatures still to come potentially there is still the risk of fires in open areas of land easily spreading and becoming out of control.

In June and July 2018 crews attended 551 fires in the open across the county, an increase of more than 50 per cent on the previous year. Last July alone saw crews attend 376 fires in the open in various places around the county. This year we believe the high temperatures will continue into August.

The Service's Combined Fire Control has also seen a sharp increase in the amount of emergency calls they have received reporting incidents in Cambridgeshire and Suffolk. Almost 4,000 calls were answered by emergency call handlers in June and July, an increase of 13 per cent from the previous year.

Group Commander Paul Clarke, head of community fire safety at Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service, said: "We want to help ensure that people enjoy the sunny weather while it's here safely. High temperatures and dry areas of land can be perfect conditions for a fire to spread. Something as simple as not stubbing a cigarette out properly, or using a disposable barbecue on grass, can start a fire that can develop quickly."

There are seven simple steps we urge residents to take to help prevent an outdoor fire:

1. Ensure cigarettes are completely out.
2. Do not throw cigarettes out of car windows onto grass verges or vegetation.
3. Put disposable barbecues on bricks, do not place directly on grass.
4. Do not leave glass bottles lying on the ground, the sun's rays reflect through the glass and can start a fire.
5. When camping, do not leave a campfire unattended and make sure it is completely out before you leave it
6. Use barbecues on a hard, flat surface, away from grass, shrubs or fencing.
7. Talk to your children about the dangers of starting a fire.

MARSH MAIL - News from Linton Village College

Learning to become more responsible and independent is a key part of adolescence. We welcomed our new cohort of 180 Year 6 students to Linton Village College at the start of July for their induction programme. It was great to see how much confidence they developed over the two days with us. Initial anxieties about navigating a larger school, managing new catering arrangements and acclimatising to different learning environments and lessons were soon allayed.

In my introductory assembly to parents/carers I spoke about how similar the emotions of fear and excitement are. The adrenaline rush that comes from experiencing a thrilling challenge can be very close to the daunting sensation of being out of your comfort zone.

Our older students also have the opportunity to broaden their horizons and engage in new adventures. A group of our outgoing Year 11 students have ventured on a trip of a lifetime through a Camps International expedition to Kenya. Their month in Africa will involve community volunteering as well and immersing themselves in the local culture and landscape. Meanwhile other LVC students have performed on the Symphonic Wind Orchestra tour in Lake Garda, Italy, and many have benefited from an enriching Geography excursion to Snowdon.

The risk assessments that I read and sign off for various extra-curricular opportunities highlight the dangers inherent in adventurous activities. However, managing risk in a safe and controlled manner is an integral part of growing up. The many enrichment events that we offer at LVC provide students with the ability to learn how to do this with the support of responsible adults.

Our recent PSHE day at Linton Village College focused on many aspects of healthy lifestyles including topics such as developing relationships, managing conflict, careers planning and team building. Students were fortunate to benefit from the expertise of external speakers, including local specialist charitable organisations and the community Police. Sergeant Priestley also led a drugs education information evening for parents/carers which was well attended, providing an overview of the County Lines phenomenon and equipping attendees with an understanding of the risks associated with this drug distribution model and how to report information to www.cambs.police.uk/report/Report-Shared/Report-a-crime.

**COULD YOU USE UP TO £500 FOR A PROJECT?**

- You explain what you would like the money for and how you intend to spend it. The application must be in writing, and include how much money you need
- The Trustees consider the application. We decide whether we can support you and how much we can afford to provide. This could be up to a maximum of £500
- We provide the funds and you complete your project
- You send us details of how you spent the money - we expect you to provide evidence of what you did with it

We can look at all sorts of projects, but they need to have some educational purpose. We have helped a range of overseas travel projects, provided money to help buy special equipment for A-level studies and helped with the costs of attending courses and events with the Guides. If you are applying to an apprenticeship scheme, or to a university, the award could help towards the purchase of books, IT, material, equipment and so on. EAST CAMBS DISTRICT COUNCILLORS' REPORTS

BOTTISHAM WARD - Brinkley, Westley Waterless and part of Burrough Green Parishes.

Last month we reported on the Council's decision to deliver at least 46 affordable houses on the estate which it was buying from the MOD. Unfortunately, the extraordinary meeting called for 19 June was not used by the administration to agree the exact number of affordable houses and how many would be for rent. Instead, they used the meeting to rescind the decision made in May. This means that of the 92 homes being delivered by the Council's subsidiary company, just 15 will be affordable and none of them will be for rent. This is a missed opportunity to offer affordable homes to the 710 applicants on the waiting list. We had hoped that including more affordable housing in a scheme devised by ECDC would set an example to other property developers in the whole district, including here in Bottisham ward.

As all candidates in the local elections had called for more affordable housing, this seemed a strange decision. We therefore reviewed the published accounts for the Council's subsidiary company - East Cambs Trading Company Ltd - <https://beta.companieshouse.gov.uk/company/10061867/filing-history>. We raised the state of the subsidiary company's finances at the Council's Finance & Assets Committee and asked to see the draft accounts for the year ended 31 March 2019 at our next meeting later this month.

Clearly, we think the company should be financially sustainable, but more fundamentally, we think that the Council owned development company should deliver Council priorities. That means it should be providing affordable housing and social housing as well as the market-rate housing needed to fund the projects.

The Committee also discussed the LCTR which replaced Council Tax Benefit. The Benefit was paid for by central government but the LCTR has to be funded by the Council, with some grant from government. There is concern that as Universal Credit is rolled out locally, people will struggle to pay their Council Tax and we need to have a system in place which will make it easier for them to pay and therefore easier for the Council to collect. *Fortunately, it seems that the agency for LCTR, Anglia Revenue Partnerships, is supportive of alleviating any possible hardship.*

The Operational Services Committee met on 17 June. The main business was to review the performance of the waste collection and street cleansing services. Unfortunately, there are still no plans to supply black bins. This means we are all still using black bin bags at a time when everyone is calling for removing single use plastics.

One local resident attended our first District Councillors' Surgery in Bottisham and we were able to resolve their queries. We met more residents while we

were sharing a pint at the The Bell. Our next District Councillors' Surgery is on Thursday 22 August at 6.30-7.45 pm at the Village Hall, Swaffham Prior, followed by a 'Meet your Councillors' at 8.00pm in the Red Lion, Swaffham Prior. Following that, we will hold a Surgery on Tuesday 24 September at 6.30-7.45 pm in the Passage Hall Lode, followed by a 'Meet your Councillors' at 8.00pm in the Shed, Lode.

It has been an honour to represent Burrough Green on the District Council since February 2016 and with the boundary changes, I was elected to continue to represent the village, as part of the Woodditton Ward together with my newly elected colleague Councillor Amy Starkey.

The new Council with its tighter political make-up, poses new challenges to deliver the manifesto on which we were elected.

In our election promises, we stated that we wanted better recreational facilities in the south of the District, whether that be smaller projects or concentrating on a bigger facility in one village and we are already working with parishes on that.

The survey that we undertook last Autumn, gave us a lot of information about what residents want or expect and we will be working to achieve those aims.

Late Summer

Others ask why they're invited, burdened by the wrongs they've done.
Christ insists that all are welcome. There is room for everyone.
Bring your joy and bring your sadness, and prepare to be surprised
by the host whose hands are wounded, who will open up your eyes
when he blesses bread and breaks it — truth and manna from above!*
