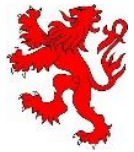

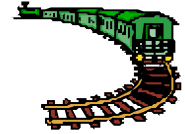

LINTON HEALTH CENTRE - FLU CLINICS

Flu jabs are recommended for everyone aged 65 and over and those in clinical at-risk groups. Once again we will be running our Saturday mornings clinics starting on 3rd October. We are taking bookings now. We have over 2,600 patients requiring immunisation, so we ask for your help in booking a Saturday appointment if you possibly can. This will help to minimise the impact on our nurses' weekday appointments.

Children aged 2, 3 and 4 on the 1st September, and those in at-risk groups aged 2-17, are eligible to receive the nasal spray flu vaccine. We have been informed that this vaccine will not be available at the start of the flu campaign, so we will book children in to the clinics on 17th and 24th October only.

The shingles vaccine is also available to people who are aged 70 and 78 on the 1st September 2015. This is a one-off vaccine that can be given at the same time as the flu jab. In addition, anyone who was eligible for immunisation in the first two years of the shingles programme but who has not yet been vaccinated remains eligible until their 80th birthday. This includes people aged 71 and 72 and people aged 79 on the 1st September 2015.

**VISIT TO BURROUGH GREEN BY LUCY FRAZER,**  
**South East Cambridgeshire's New MP**

A small group of local residents braved a wet and dark summer's evening to meet Lucy in the Reading Room on Wednesday 5th August. Introduced by County Councillor, Mathew Shuter, and welcomed by Greg Way on behalf of the parish council, Lucy said she had written to all 50 parishes in her constituency offering to make herself known, and provide an opportunity for issues to be raised.

Her particular interests were education funding, infrastructure, and business support. The national funding formula for schools disadvantaged Cambridgeshire. She had already raised the issue with the Secretary of State for Education, and had been appointed to the Education Select Committee. She was pleased that an additional £23m had been allocated to the county for 2015/16, and 2016/17. She had visited all the secondary schools in her constituency and was happy to extend this to primary schools; and to encourage inter school debates; and to offer visits to the House of Commons.

Her concerns about infrastructure mainly focused on transport. She had raised concerns about progressing the completion of the Ely bypass with the Roads Minister, and had also met Cambridgeshire CC to emphasize the importance of keeping this scheme to timetable.

Building the local economy was important. She was determined to support business growth and had met with the leaders of the County Council, Cambridge City, South Cambridgeshire, and East Cambridgeshire District Councils; and the Vice Chancellor of Cambridge University with a view to encouraging a co-ordinated plan for development.

Residents raised speeding through the village and the need for a regular police presence in the mornings and evenings. Lucy responded by saying she would work with the county council and police commissioner to address concerns about following up speeding by Suffolk motorists, and would be monitoring police support for rural communities that were concerned about the excessive speed of through traffic.

When asked about the growing sanctions movement against Israel she said there were two sides to this Middle East issue and that it was essential to have peace. She had spent some time working in Israel drafting a constitution for the West Bank. Whilst Palestinian rights needed to be respected, so did the right of Israel to exist.

She would appreciate the views of constituents on assisted dying. Parliament would be debating the issues, and there would be a free vote to permit

legislation to assist those who were terminally ill with only six months to live. The majority of those present supported a change to the law subject to medical safeguards.

**ELECTORAL ROLL UPDATE - Recruitment**

We are looking to recruit canvassers for this year's annual canvass process. Fees vary depending on location and the size of the area. A bonus scheme is based on % returns at the end of the canvass.

Canvassers are employed to hand deliver Electoral Registration forms to approx. 37,000 households in the East Cambridgeshire District and just over 8,000 require a personal canvass visit to collect information where forms have not been submitted.

We are now looking to recruit canvassers for the second part of the process and this is to door knock any property that has not returned a form, or to door knock an individual that has not returned a form. You have from 2<sup>nd</sup> October through to the 30<sup>th</sup> October to complete the work.

You must have experience of working with the general public, local knowledge of the area in which you are applying to work and must not be politically active or be a Councillor. All training and materials will be provided, the majority of visits will be most effective during evenings and weekends, meaning it can fit in with other commitments. **SEPTEMBER BULLETIN FROM CAMBRIDGESHIRE  
FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE**

HARVEST is upon us and we're calling on local residents to help our fight against straw stack arson.

Stack fires can quickly spread and not only endanger people and livestock, but also life-long work on farms. Stacks burn very slowly meaning crews are committed for long periods of time, making them unavailable for other emergencies. Don't forget, many firefighters attending incidents like these in rural parts of our county are on-call personnel and their retention at a stack fire impacts directly upon business and services in their community.

What can you do? We're urging residents and those passing through rural areas to keep a careful watch. Do you see someone acting suspiciously around stores of hay or straw? Is there an unusual vehicle near farm buildings? Become a community member of Arson Watch and keep an eye on stacks in your area.

Report suspicious activity to police on 101 and dial 999 if you see a stack fire.
